

Congratulations are in order for past Business Manager Philip Moore. Brother Moore has dedicated the last 44 years of his life to Local 181. On behalf of all of Local 181, we wish Philip and Charlyn a happy and blessed retirement.

I would like to take this time to thank our Constitutional Officers for installing me as Business Manager

of Local 181 to fulfill the unexpired term of Brother Moore. Words cannot describe the honor I have to serve our Local in this role. I will do my absolute best for all of us in Local 181 and our families.

Since our last newsletter, I would like to welcome Drew Preston as Business Agent in District 1, Will Broughton, Business Agent in District 3 and Justin Outland, Business Agent in District 5. Thank you all for serving Local 181 in this capacity.

At the time of this newsletter Local 181's work and man hours are strong and look very promising for the future. Local 181's man hours are up 11.40% from the last year. There are multiple projects across the Local that are employing or will be employing 20, 30, 40 or even more operating engineers. We have projects ranging from new scrubbers on coal plants, ash pond clean ups, auto factory expansions, water treatment plants, simple cycle gas plants, large interstate bridge and river crossings, new hospitals, and new multi-billion-dollar battery plants. It is a great time to be an Operating Engineer.

We have elections coming across Local 181 on November 8th. I will remind everyone that thanks to how Kentucky has voted the last couple of elections, on January 1, 2023, the unemployment benefits will go from 26 weeks to 16 weeks for our union brothers and sisters. It is even worse for individuals who do not belong to a union. This reduction in weeks of eligibility to draw unemployment benefits was due to the passing of House Bill 4. Unfortunately, there are members of Local 181 that voted for the very people that pushed and voted yes for this bill. Votes have consequences and Local 181 just got handed one. I am pleading to all 181 Members to take five minutes and educate yourself on who the candidates are and what their intentions will be if elected, irrespective of Republican or Democratic party. If you're unable to decide or don't have the time to research, please trust Local 181's endorsement. A list of endorsed candidates is in this newsletter.

Furthermore, I would like to encourage all our brothers and sisters to visit Local 181's training sites. Our contractors are expecting qualified operators now more than ever. With that, I am challenging each and every one of us to do better at being our brothers' and sisters' keeper. Take more time to help a fellow operator, take more time to teach and show a fellow operator, take more time to lead by example for those who need it. Let's remind each other of the monthly union meetings. Every good union member and good operator was helped by someone.

In addition, I want to remind each member to attend our General Membership meeting to be held December 10, 2022, at Henderson Headquarters, 700 N. Elm Street, Henderson, KY.

With the holidays approaching, I would like to personally wish all members and their families a Happy Thanksgiving, a Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year.

We would like to welcome Andrew Preston as the new Business Agent at District One. Drew has been a member of Local 181 for 17 years and will be an asset to our Local.

At this time, work in Local 181 District One is going strong with several jobs going on over the whole district. This work should have operators on the job site for several months.

In Hancock County, Hodskins Services, State Group and TMI are at Commonwealth Aluminum with a few operators working currently. Maxim Crane and C J Mahan are working at Cannelton Dam on the locks and gates.

In Henderson County, we have

Sterett Crane, Hazex, Deig Bros., and Fessler and Bowman at Pratt Paper with quite a few operators on site. Keller North American is doing foundation work for a new water tank in the same area. The I-69 project is kicking off for Ragle Inc. with around 20 Local 181 operators working on site at this time.

Muhlenberg County, Paradise work has been good with operators working for Azco Inc., Burns & McDonnell along with W. B. Koester, Helmkamp Construction and M J Electric. This work will continue on the simple cycle project and should last into 2023 with several operators on site.

Also. Fisher Contracting was awarded the gypsum stack reclamation contract and will employ several operators. This portion of the TVA reclamation should last for years. They are using a wide range of equipment to perform this task from GPS dozers. GPS scrapers and excavators.

In addition, the demolition of the TVA coal plant continues with DH Griffin on site. They have six to eight operators prepping the three cooling towers for implosion, which should take place mid-November. The cleanup from the implosion should last until the spring of 2023. G-UB-MK has been working to prepare the plant for demolition as well.

Finally, Wright Brothers and Barnard Construction are on site as well at the time of this writing. There are 70 to 80 operating engineers working for multiple contractors with more work planned.

In Warren County, work at the GM Warehouse has kept 15 to 20 members working throughout the summer. Walbridge Equipment Installation LLC, along with Independence Excavating, are working to expand the existing building. At the GM plant in Bowling Green, The Boldt Company has been keeping operators working after the storm damage repairs but is expected to pick up more work in the winter months along with Gallagher-Kaiser.

In Simpson County, work at Matalco was steady for a few operators with Michels and Abel doing an expansion project that lasted through the summer months.

In closing, we would like to remind everyone that our monthly District meetings (except June and December) are held in Henderson, Ky, at the Headquarters Office on the first Tuesday of the month at 7:30 p.m. and at the Bowling Green Office on the second Tuesday of the month at 7:30 p.m.

Work in District Two has been very strong with a good mix of Heavy/ Highway and Building work. Barring any major economic setbacks, work looks to continue strong into the next few years

Work being performed in District Two is as follows: Lehigh Cement plant in Mitchell; Industrial Contractors is still on site working on various projects and there is a large stripping project waiting to be awarded. Mcintyre Brothers has a few small jobs in the GM Foundry and both Sieboldt and Mitchell Quarries are moving ahead with crushing operations. Bowen and Nicholson are still on site at Crane Naval Base for the Underwater Missile Test Facility. Work should pick up for the excavation sometime early winter.

At Sabic, there is a plant outage and general maintenance with BMWC. Mel-Kay and Sterett Crane. Russell's Excavating has the contract for the site's mowing and snow removal. Hayden Wrecking has a couple of demolition projects at Sabic as well. Skanska has been Awarded a foundation project at BWXT Technologies that should last into next year. At Country Mark Refinery, BMWC, Mel-Kay and Russell's Excavating are all working on the current projects at this site as well. Reynolds has a sewer line project in the Posey County area with a couple of directional drill companies on site. Bowen and Sterling continue to pick up work at the Gibson County Duke Plant with outage work on Units 1, 2 & 3. These will last into March of next year. F. A. Wilhelm has ash pond work at the Duke site that should last until the end of the year and they are bidding on several other projects on site. Blankenberger Brothers has ash cell work at AB Brown and IPL Petersburg. Toyota will continue to have

small projects and some weekend work through the end of the year with Custom Mechanical, TMI, L.G. Fox, State Group, Skanska and Mel-Kay. W. B. Koester has a parking lot expansion and a rail spur project at Toyota as well. Skanska is performing the maintenance work at IPL Petersburg along with several other contractors on site. Debra-Kuempl has a WWTP in Pike County, that is just getting started with Koberstein and Maxim Crane performing work there as well. E&B Paving and J. H. Rudolph both have several paving projects going in Posey, Gibson & Pike Counties. W B Koester and Ragle both have several road & bridge work projects going in these areas. The Wabash River railroad truss project with sheet pile services should last a few more months depending on the weather. Work looks to stay very busy throughout the area with proposed solar projects in these three counties.

Infrastructure Systems has water line projects in Tell City and Evansville. JBI has sidewalks and curb replacement in Tell City. E&B Paving has paving on the street with the sidewalk replacement project as well as some slide corrections on Hwy. 66 and State Road 145. At Cleveland Cliffs, Graycor Industrial, TMI, Mel-Kay and State Group have all had various small maintenance projects throughout the summer with Graycor being awarded a fall outage project. At AEP Rockport we have Entact closing out an ash pond with work projected to last through 2024. Enerfab Industrial has maintenance and outage work at the site also. Warrick County has an abundance of activity at the ALCOA/ Kaiser Aluminum plant site. Kaiser has expanded the finishing department by adding a new finishing roll coating line. Skanska is the general contractor of the

projects employing several operators and having Klenck Companies, Keller North American and Maxim Crane as subcontractors. BMWC was the successful bidder on the first phase of the new boiler house project at the Kaiser site with Goettle currently doing foundation work at the site. Sterling Industrial has maintenance work at ALCOA/Kaiser and AGC Power plants. Enerfab Industrial has fall outage work at AGC Power Plant. Deig Bros has a new sub-station being constructed at the location. The F.B. Culley Station Power Plant has Sterling Industrial, Sterett Crane and Rigging, Nicholson and Ash Management Services conducting various projects. Ragle Inc. has a sewer expansion project in Newburgh. Along with several other projects in Warrick and Vanderburgh counties. E&B Paving, JBI and J.H. Rudolph have road projects in Warrick County. In the Evansville/Vanderburgh County area there are waterline upgrade projects being performed by Infrastructure Systems, Blankenberger Bros. and Ragle. JBI, Blankenberger Bros., Ragle, J.H. Rudolph and E&B Paving have various road projects. Kokosing Industrial still has work at the East Side treatment plant with hopes to start on the new water treatment facility early next year.

In closing, we would encourage everyone to attend the monthly district meetings held the first Tuesday of the month (Except for June and December) at 7:30pm. We would also like to remind everyone to check your certifications, drug cards, and continue with skills upgrades at the training site. We would also like to thank the Lynnville Training site staff and all the volunteers for all the help at the Labor Day events. District 3 is proud to report that our district has been exceptionally busy with little chance of slowing in the foreseeable future. From several contractors working on the highways throughout Southern Indiana and Kentucky, to Bowen Engineering's multiple ongoing projects, and one of the largest construction projects in the nation with BOSK Ford, District 3 continues to see incredible work. The likelihood of a slow winter season is near non-existent; we look forward to continuing and consistent work for the district.

The BOSK Ford Battery Plant will be the largest project in the history of Local 181. Located in central Glendale, Kentucky, BOSK will employ hundreds of Operating Engineers both during construction and for years of maintenance to come. Much like the other Ford plants within the district, we can expect continual work for our members from this project for the foreseeable future from a variety of contractors. Barton Malow is working on the grade and drain portion of the project, as well as the concrete work. Sterett Crane and Rigging currently is in the process of mobilizing for the steel erection of the buildings. Malcom Drilling has several crews on-site drilling for and installing the caissons that will support the superstructure. Michels Construction will have a large package for the ground improvement and foundation work as well. Also on-site are Mt. Carmel Stabilization and Specialties to handle all soil stabilization needs. Bowen Engineering will soon move in to build two large power substations that will power the facilities.

The size, scope and man-power requirements of this project cannot be understated, as we are currently adding Operating Engineers to all aspects of this project multiple times a week. Predictions for the winter, and years to come, are lasting and consistent needs for Operating Engineers on this project.

The highway work persists with strength in Indiana. W.B. Koester continues with ash pond remediation at the Gallagher Powerhouse in New Albany, Indiana, and are currently scheduled for the next two years at Gallagher with the opportunity to bid demolition work. Milestone completed milling and resurfacing on I-65 from Edinburgh, Indiana to Columbus, Indiana as well as their work in Salem, Indiana with new storm water drainage, curbs and sidewalks. The new bridge has been finished; with more storm drain, curb, and sidewalk work to continue through the winter months. E&B Paving is working in Georgetown, Indiana on Innovation Parkway with MSE walls and new ramps to I-64. Kokosing Construction is continuing repair and refurbishment on the Sherman-Minton bridge across the Ohio River. This will continue into 2024. Dave O'Mara Contractors has several paving and bridge reconstruction projects throughout Southern Indiana, as well as work in Clark County on a new sanitary sewer line off Veterans Parkway. Whittenburg Construction is constructing two new hotels in Clarksville, Indiana, as well as in Nulu, Kentucky.

Highway work in Kentucky sees continued growth as well. E&B Paving is still working at the Louisville Airport, with a new geothermal field that will provide heating and cooling for the airport. On Bardstown Road, they are repairing sidewalk and laying new pavement. The new UPS Hangar will continue to see a work presence, from Whittenburg's digging and pouring new foundation, to Midwest Steel's two 2250 crawlers setting structural trusses, with miscellaneous steel and decking projects running into the winter season. The new VA Hospital is and will continue to employ members through both Goettle and F.A. Wilhelm for various jobs. Goettle persists with drilling caissons and setting rebar cages for new foundations, as F.A. Wilhelm forms up concrete foundations for the first floor and a new parking garage on site. Wilhelm will also see the construction of a new club house in turn one, and seating at Churchill Downs, to be completed by the next Derby.

Overall, highway work in the winter is forecasted as very robust, with the Blue Oval/SK site and Ford's announcing of a 700-million-dollar investment at the Ford Kentucky Truck Plant.

There are considerable ongoing projects throughout District 3 beyond the BOSK plant and Highway work. Bowen Engineering continues with multiple projects in our area, and has completed the Wastewater Treatment Plant in Scottsburg, Indiana as well as the Water Treatment Plant in Charlestown, Indiana. Bowen has also begun work in Lawrenceburg, Indiana, rehabbing the existing Wastewater Treatment Plant. There are several projects predicted to last beyond 2022, likely through 2024; including R.B. Jergens' Ash Cell Closure Project at the Clifty Creek Powerhouse in Madison, Indiana, several mass excavation projects in Battletown, Kentucky by Turner Contracting, Inc., and the Rumpke landfill project in Medora, Indiana. Also predicted to be lasting through 2023 is work at the NuCor Steel Plant in Brandenburg, Kentucky, with Lutgring Brothers, CJ Mahan, Goettle and Phillips Hardy being kept incredibly busy at this site. HIS Constructors celebrates the completion of a two-year long project at the Greensburg Airport in Greensburg, Indiana. Various pipeline projects in the district employ Integrity Kokosing with their "take up and relay" in the Clark County area, and Otis Minnesota installing "Pig Launchers and Receivers" in the Seymour/Columbus, Indiana areas.

As always, we encourage all to take advantage of the training sites in Boston, Kentucky, and Lynnville, Indiana, to hone their working skills. We are always looking for candidates for the Apprentice Programs.

District 3 wishes all a prosperous 2022, and an even greater welcome into 2023.

We would like to thank everyone who came out to the Labor Day picnic at Fort Boonesborough State Park. This is good fellowship and food for all 181 members to enjoy.

Our work in District 4 has been slow to get started this year but we have had several small jobs to keep a lot of hands working.

Goettle is finishing in Harlan County on Pine Mountain, doing a retaining wall that has five to six operators.

Ryan Inc. Central is doing a job at East Kentucky Power in Maysville with ten operators and this job will last until October 2023. They are doing a fly ash cell and a sediment pond.

Toyota is up and down with some shut down work coming in November and December of this year, which will require certifications to run certain pieces of equipment plus a 10-hour OSHA.

Schnabel has picked up a job in Breathitt County at Panbowl Lake, which was bid for sheet pile. It is to control erosion around the dam due to the flooding that occurred in July.



American Bridge has picked up a job at Wolf Creek Dam. It is a \$109 million dollar job to replace the tainter gates. Not much else is known at this time since the job was just awarded September 29. But we do know that there will be Local 181 operators on this job.

Capital City Group has a small outage going on at Kentucky Power in Hazard for Kent Power. D-Crane Rental is working in Shepherdsville, Georgetown and at the Army Depot. Padgett is working in Fayette County. D-Crane Rental and Padgett employ eight to ten operators. Little Creek Construction became signatory earlier this year and has eight to ten operators working in Fayette County. Foltz Welding has a pipeline job in Versailles. It is 1,800 feet of take-up and relay, with four operators on site. Hayes Drilling has work in various locations throughout District 4. McAbee picked up a job at Venison Valley Landfill, doing methane recovery and will have work until the end of February 2023.

Please stay up to date on your certifications and your skills. If you receive a new certification or a new skill, please provide a copy of the certification at our office.

In closing, we would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

We want to thank all the members and their families for attending the 2022 Labor Day parade and picnic in Paducah. We were very excited to be able to get together again since Covid-19 has stood in our way for the past couple years.

We had a wonderful turnout at both picnic and parade. We missed the ones who could not attend and hope to see you and your families in 2023. A huge thank you to everyone who helped, without your help these events would not be possible.

District Five has had a significant amount of work since the start of the 2022 summer, and we are praying that trend continues for the years to come. With that being said, we would like to welcome Justin Outland as the new Business Agent for District Five. Justin will be a great asset and we believe he will do everything he can for not only District Five members but for Local 181 as a whole. TVA Shawnee Steam plant has been strong with multiple contractors in and out all summer. G-UB-MK has outage work inside the plant and is now gearing up for another massive three-to-four year long scrubber project. G-UB-MK is predicting to have twenty plus operators between days and nights combined for this project and expected to work year-round. Also at Shawnee, Kiewit Constructors has an average of forty plus operators and still has an estimated 3.5 million cubic yards of ash still to move and cover up. Kiewit's work is looking to slow down some in late winter but will be back full force as soon as the weather breaks.

Smith Construction is busy with multiple bridge projects throughout District Five, including the large Smithland Bridge project at Smithland, Kentucky. The building of this bridge span and setting was a team effort between Smith Construction and American Bridge Company that has gone very well. Smith Construction will continue working on the approaches of this bridge and finish deck work in hopes to be completed by November 2023.

Work in Calvert City is looking to be very busy for the next couple of years, with a large project starting at Arkema and Westlake looking to have a big spring outage in April. There is also some Hazmat work coming to Westlake and will require operators with Hazmat Certs.

Novelis in Guthrie, Kentucky is going to have a large expansion and contractors are already calling for operators on that project. We also have contractors calling for rates on the new battery plant in Hopkinsville, Kentucky.

We want to remind everyone to take advantage of both training sites to upgrade skills and obtain certifications and re-certifications. Anyone who does not have 10-hour OSHA or rigging and signaling and Hazmat Certification should get them as they are being required more and more frequently.

In closing we want to encourage all members to attend the monthly meetings held the first Tuesday of every month (except June and December) at the AFL-CIO building located at 1202 South 4th street, Paducah, KY at 7:30 pm. The newsletter should be reaching our members in the Holiday season, so we want to wish everyone in District Five a Happy Holiday Season and Happy New Year!

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family safe and healthy. By the time you receive this letter the holiday season will be upon us. Some holiday cheer will be good for all, after the last couple years we have

experienced, hopefully the Covid pandemic is nearing a close.

It has been some time since the last newsletter, and I have good news to share with you all. The District Six Union Hall has moved! We moved to a bigger, better building located at 1278 Porter Rd, Catlettsburg, KY 41129 that is owned by IUOE Local 181. The new location has a meeting room with lots of space for classes and activities we plan to have in the future. We encourage you to stop by to visit and see your new location. We also urge you to attend your District meeting. This is your Union and your livelihood; help protect it!

Presently, Deep South Crane & Rigging has a small outage going on with around 60 operators at Marathon Petroleum Catlettsburg Refinery. The outage will be winding down in the coming weeks. Global Scaffold and Turner Industries has also kept a few working at Marathon. We are being told an outage coming in the fall of 2023 will be bigger than we have manned before. Local 181 we will be supplying the operators. We are looking ahead and encouraging everyone to make sure you have the necessary credentials to work at Marathon and that your certifications are current. We do not want to be short on supplying operators, therefore, we need you prepared!

Deep South also has a small outage at Riverside Gas Power Plant in Louisa, Kentucky with a couple operators working two shifts. Maxim Crane had work off and on at Riverside earlier this year that kept a few working as well. Enerfab has ongoing work at the AEP facility in Louisa, Kentucky that keeps a couple working year-round. J & J General Maintenance, J&H Reinforcing & Structural, Mi-De-Con, Beaver Excavating and W B Fosson & Sons have all had projects in various locations in our district that have kept members working.

The pipeline work is District Six has been scarce. Associated Pipeline had a few operators in Boyd County working on slip repair for Columbia Gas. Contractors Rental had repair work on lines in Boyd and Bath Counties. Maybe we will see more pipeline work in our area in the coming year.

Triton Construction remains at work on the Russell Fork Bridge (US-460) in Pike County with over 20 operators working rain or shine. The US-460 corridor reconstruction will provide an alternate route for US-460 traffic from US-23 near Yeager, Kentucky, to the Breaks Interstate Park near Breaks, Virginia.

Independence Excavating began demolition of AK Steel Plant in October 2021, the plant closed for good in 2019. AK Steel had been here 100 years; it had a good long run and provided a lot of prosperity to the area. The demo is nearing the end and has

kept around 20 operators working steady. Cleveland Cliffs acquired the property, and we are hopeful they will continue to make this site a benefit and blessing to the area.

A special thanks to all who helped and participated in the Catlettsburg Labor Day Parade. Without your help it would not be possible. I would also like to thank all the members who keep turning out for the monthly Union Meeting. Keep coming back! I wish each and every member a happy and prosperous new year. Prescription Drug Benefit

We are excited to announce that starting January 1, 2023, we will implement a Retail 90-Day Network Program for the Caremark members. This voluntary program provides an opportunity for participants to get a 90-day supply of maintenance medications at a retail pharmacy rather than having to fill three 30-day scripts at the pharmacy or obtaining a 90-day fill via mail order. Below is the co-payment structure for the three choices you will now have:

The network includes all major chains and most independent pharmacies. To find out if your pharmacy participates in this prescription program, please call the pharmacy directly.

Enrollment Forms

Over the past several months, the Fund office has mailed out enrollment forms to all of our eligible members. If you haven't returned the form, please take a few minutes to complete it and return to us so that we can make sure all of your information is up-to-date and correct. We are required to have an updated form every three years. We are also required to obtain marriage licenses and birth certificates if we do not have them on file.

Please remember to report any changes to the Fund office as soon as possible, such as: marriage, divorce, adding dependents, change of beneficiary, change of address, etc. This information is not only to keep your records up to date in our office, but it is also shared with our plan partners: Anthem, Caremark and Laborfirst (Humana). As a reminder, your information is not shared between the Fund Office, Central Pension, and Local 181 Union Hall.

Reminder of Availability of HIPAA Notice of Privacy Practices

As you know, International Union of Operating Engineers Locals 181, 320 & TVA Health & Welfare Trust Fund maintains a HIPAA Notice of Privacy Practices

("Privacy Notice") describing how health information about individuals covered under the plan may be used and disclosed. While we distributed the Privacy Notice

to all covered individuals previously, the HIPAA Privacy Rule requires that, at least every three years, we notify currently covered individuals of the availability of the Privacy Notice and how to obtain a

copy of it. You may obtain a copy of our Privacy Notice by writing to/contacting the Fund Office, 700 North Elm Street, P. O. Box 1179, Henderson, Kentucky 42419, 800-242-7076 or 800-626-7024.

Health Reimbursement Account (HRA)

The Health Reimbursement Account was established for all eligible Active participants or any retiree or early retiree with active work hours. A portion of hourly Employer Contributions received is deposited into an eligible participant's HRA. This money is to be used exclusively to cover certain medical-related out-of-pocket expenses. Each participant's balance in their HRA will be forfeited fol-

lowing 12 consecutive months of ineligibility under the Plan. Expenses incurred, for dates of service while eligible, and filed within the 12-month period will be covered by the HRA, if otherwise eligible for reimbursement. HRA balances are not the property of the participant in whose name they are established. At all times, amounts in the HRA are the property of the Fund.

As a reminder, keep all itemized receipts each time you use your HRA card.

You may use your card for eligible expenses such as:

* Self-Payments * Prescription co-pays * Medical coinsurance

* Vision (exams & prescription glasses) * Dental visits

If you use the card for an ineligible expense, you will be required to refund your HRA account.

We are here to answer your questions regarding eligibility and benefits. Feel free to contact us with any questions you may have.
